Missouri River Bridge Pedestrian and Bicycle Attachment

Project Description: The new pedestrian and bicycle attachment is eight feet wide and includes two lookout points with a view of the Missouri State Capitol.

The ramp structure on the north side of the river allows access to the Katy Trail.

The attachment provides a safer and more convenient way to walk and bike across the Missouri River.

Partners: The City of Jefferson, Missouri Department of Natural Resources, Missouri State Parks Foundation and the Missouri Department of Transportation partnered to construct the project.

U.S. 63 Northbound Missouri River Bridge
in Jefferson City, Missouri

Award Cost: \$6.7 million
